Overview of the Resort Sector in the Maldives

The Census of 2022 encompassed all resorts where individuals resided on the census night, regardless of their operational status or developmental stage. Consequently, Census 2022 revealed the existence of 168 resort islands.


Kaafu Atoll holds the highest number of resorts (55), trailed by Baa Atoll and Alif Dhaal Atoll (17 resorts each). Conversely, Haa Dhaal, Faafu, and Thaa Atoll each had a solitary resort island






Employment in Resort Sector

The total employed population not only includes those workers residing in the resort but also comprise of those whose employed in the resort but usual resident is another island. From the total 59,627 employees in resort sector only 35% are Maldivians

Resort employment is comprising of mainly Males (89%) and females contributes to only 11% of resort employment


Resort Employees by age group


Among females, in all age groups except 15-19 and 60-64 age group, foreigners largely dominate and hold most jobs compared to locals

Among males holding jobs between 15-19 years, more than 90% are held by Maldivians. Thereafter, in all other age groups except for above ages 60, foreigners dominate the jobs with a huge percentage






Resort Occupations

Cleaners, chefs, and waiters emerge as the most sought-after occupations. While waiters and cleaners exhibit nearly equal representation of Maldivians and foreigners, the majority of chefs 90% within the total resort workforce—are foreigners




Resort Employees Skills mismatch by level of Education Attained

Among resort employees more than 50% of workers in occupations such as Technicians & associate professionals, Skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers and craft and related trades workers are undereducated.

Workers in resort filling occupations such as elementary occupations (55%) have excess qualification to that required for the job






Key source islands Resort Employees to resorts by Atolls

Haa Alif, Haa Dhaal and Shaviyani Atoll draws a considerable portion of its resort employees from Haa Alif Atoll (36%).

In Kaafu Atoll resorts, a notable 15% of employees primarily hail from Seenu Atoll.

Gafu Dhaalu and Seenu Atoll employ the highest percentage of workers (76%) from within the Atoll.






Global composition of migrant resort employees in the Maldives

Disability Reporting Patterns




Commuting Employees


From the total employed in resort only 13% was identified as they work in the resort but reside in another island

7499 employees commuting to the resorts of which 709 are females and 5,477 are males. Among the females commuting to resort to work majority are Maldivians (83%) and only few are foreigners (17%). Similar pattern is vivid among commuting male employees among Maldivians and foreigners with 81% and 19% respectively




Atoll wise commuting patterns of resort employees

Among men commuting for work to resorts most are from Male' followed by Kaafu and Seenu Atoll with 25%, 11% and 8% respectively. The Atoll with least number of workers commuting to resorts is in Faafu Atoll with only 25 male workers.

Most female commuters to work are from Male' (50%), Kaafu (8%) and Seenu Atoll (6%).
